Welcome to the February 2025 edition of the **Luzerne Intermediate Unit (LIU) Office of Professional Learning's (OPL)** monthly education bulletin. This special edition of the OPL Education Bulletin will focus on Remake Learning Days (RLD). From May 1st to May 23rd, RLD asks centers of learning to open their doors to allow families to learn together. Students, along with their caregivers, can explore interactive learning events like building robots, inventing with 3D printers, experiment like a scientist, explore student voice, create their own art or music, and much more.



REMAKE LEARNING DAYS

LEARNING THEMES

Each RLD event is aligned to a learning theme to better inform participants of the general goal of each planned community event. There are five STEAM-driven learning themes for families plus an additional theme specific to professional development for educators.



ARTS is hands-on learning and expression through all kinds of art: theatre, dance, visual art, music, photography, and more!



MAKER "Making" is about taking things apart and putting it back together. Tinker, build, and create with all kinds of materials. Try a 3D printer, take apart a toy to see what's inside and then rebuild it, or create a marshmallow tower!



OUTDOOR LEARNING is about experiencing and learning about the natural world. How can we think about the environment, sustainability, and more by exploring our very own backyards?



SCIENCE is all about experimentation! Kids and adults can explore chemistry, biology, geography and more. How does our world work? What can we test and explore in the world around us?



TECHNOLOGY gives kids the chance to explore their digital world. Want to try coding? Build robots? Learn circuitry? Look for technology events that help you discover new things.



YOUTH VOICE is about youth leadership and amplifying youth voice. Youth have the ability to express themselves in so many ways such as: through audio, video, art, music, and more.

HOW CAN SCHOOLS HELP?

Remake Learning Days is comprised of regions that encompass the entirety of Pennsylvania. The Luzerne Intermediate Unit is the regional lead of the Northeast PA Remake Learning region, and it includes the Carbon Lehigh, Central Susquehanna, Colonial, Luzerne, and Northeastern Intermediate Units. Combined, these regions hosted over 100 events last school year. We hope to accomplish the same and cannot do so without the help of our local schools. Schools can help by becoming a Remake Learning Event Host and/or raising awareness of events happening in their community.

BECOMING AN EVENT HOST

One way Schools can participate in Remake Learning is by becoming an Event Host. But, what is an Event Host? Event hosts facilitate a learning experience where students can learn with their caregivers. These events are based on one or more of the Remake Learning themes and occur between May 1 - May 23, 2025.

It is recommended that you submit your event by February 19, 2025, so it may be eligible for event funding. Once your event is submitted and approved, we will provide marketing artifacts so you can share your event and the festival with your network. [Event Host Awards](#) (mini-grants) are available in **\$150, \$250, and \$500** dollar amounts and must be submitted to the Remake Days website along with completion of event host award application by the February 21, 2025 application deadline.

CAREER READY PA BACKPACK CHALLENGE

Remake Learning Days are hands-on events integrating career readiness and employability skills by exposing our students to different career paths. **Schools hosting these experiences from May 1 to May 23 qualify for the Career Ready PA Backpack Challenge.** After students attend your event, learners from K-11 can earn a career readiness artifact to be included in their summative career portfolio. Here's how it works:

- 1) Your school designs and submits an event on the Remake Learning Days website that describes how students will experience career readiness and employability skills.
- 2) Your school completes a brief survey indicating their inclusion in the Career Ready Backpack Challenge.



3) Your students attend your event and complete a brief survey reflecting on the employability skills that were aligned to the experience.

Schools with over 100 student artifact surveys completed will be awarded a banner for meeting the “Backpack Challenge.”

WHY DO STUDENTS NEED A DIGITAL ARTIFACT?

ALL PA Commonwealth public school students from K-11 must maintain a career portfolio of evidence (artifacts) as evidence of meaningful career readiness experiences. This is a **federal requirement reported in the Future Ready PA Index**—collection of publicly available school progress measures related to school and student success, including the Career Standards measure.

What are some examples of the Career Readiness Backpack Challenges in schools?

- ⇒ **STEM Fair** – Host a STEM Fair where school staff facilitate a series of stations each focused on a specific task.
- ⇒ **Content Area Exploration** – Use your in-house staff expertise to raise awareness around a specific or multiple content areas.
- ⇒ **Business Pitch Competition** – Students create and present a business idea to a panel of judges.
- ⇒ **Escape Room Challenge** – Teams solve workplace-related puzzles to build problem-solving skills.
- ⇒ **Community Service Initiative** – Teams plan and execute a volunteer project that benefits their community.
- ⇒ **Coding Challenge** – Students create a simple app, website, or game.
- ⇒ **Budgeting & Personal Finance Simulation** – Students create a mock budget for different life scenarios.
- ⇒ **Stock Market Game** – Students participate in a simulated stock market investment challenge.
- ⇒ **Career Fair Passport** – Students attend a career fair and complete guided activities such as networking with professionals.

WHAT IS A MEGA EVENT?

What makes the Career Ready PA Mega Challenge different from a Career Ready PA Backpack Challenge festival event? Each Career Ready PA region has been tasked with conducting a Remake Learning Days event specifically designed to increase school participation in the Backpack

Challenge. The Luzerne Intermediate Unit, the Northeastern PA Remake Learning Days lead, has partnered with the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders to host two STEM Days at the PNC Field in Moosic, PA. The event flyer can be found [here](#). All students that attend this event whose school has registered for the Career Ready Backpack Challenge can complete the student Backpack

survey and have a Career Readiness artifact attributed to them. The RailRiders STEM School Days are hosted at the PNC Field on May 14 and May 28.



PARENT/TEACHER AND STUDENT AMBASSADORS

The **Remake Learning Days Ambassador Program** is an opportunity for parents/teachers and youth to increase awareness, enthusiasm, and attendance during Remake Learning Days (RLD). We are looking for a total of 210 “Youth” and “Parent/Teacher” Ambassadors for the 2025 RLD Across PA festivals. Ambassadors are eligible for a honorarium of up to **\$250**. No prior experience is necessary! Apply by February 14, 2025, to be considered as a RLD Ambassador.

What do you do as an Ambassador? Whether you are a “Youth” or “Parent/Teacher” Ambassador, here is what you’ll be doing as an advocate for Remake Learning Days.

- ⇒ **Experience RLD:** Plan to attend two (2) Remake Learning Days events between May 1-23, 2025 in your PA region. Beginning in March, you’ll be able to search the RLD events calendar for events by date, learning theme, location and age group.
- ⇒ **Share about Your Events:** Prior to attending your events, share about the events you’ve chosen to attend and why you’re excited about these RLD events. You can share through your social media channels or however you communicate with your network.
- ⇒ **Give Feedback:** After attending the two events, share your feedback through an event review and post on your social media channels or however you communicate with your network.

All students in grades 9 – 12 who reside in Pennsylvania are welcome to apply. Simply fill out the form below. The application deadline is Friday, February 14, 2025, and selected Youth Ambassadors will be notified by early March. All caring adults who reside in Pennsylvania are welcome to apply for the parent/teacher program noted below.
